# 选择正确的学校



早点知道你的选项会 让你有时间访问不同 的学校、参加信息会 议以及找到可以满足 你孩子需求和志向的 学校。 选择一所像Collingwood College(如上)这样的学 校,它们具备对你孩子的学 习和发展最为有利的条件。

为了让你孩子愉快并且有积极体验的从小学到中学过渡,非常重要的是选择一个对你孩子的学习和发展最有帮助的学校。

如果你的孩子是上公立学校,那么他们通常会去离你们住家最近的中学。如果有名额,你可以选择送你的孩子去其他总课程或者重点不同的政府中学,例如音乐学校、体育学校、天主教学校或者私立学校。

要记住有些中学需要限制他们的招收以及他们——对于学校附近的特定区域或者地带——可以接收的学生名额。住宅界限可能影响你的孩子是否可以就读特定的中学。



# 访问学校



多数学校欢迎询问, 并且会安排时间让你 和你的孩子访问。

参见第5页维多利亚州教育系统示 意图。 在你注册你的孩子入学之前,你 应该访问你本地的中学以及其他 你所考虑的学校。理想情况下你 应该在5年级就开始准备。在你 孩子开学之前尽早联系,以留出 时间访问若干学校。

校长或者其他学校员工可以提供游览、教室参观和关于他们学校的信息。多数学校欢迎询问,并且会安排时间让你和你的孩子访问。

考虑问这些问题:

- 是否有可用名额?
- 有哪些费用?除了这些费用 以外,还会需要你支付什么 其他的费用?
- 学校提供什么样的教育规

#### 划?

- 老师/学校围绕什么价值观和 人生观教育他们的学生?
- 学校如何支持有特殊需要的 孩子?
- 学校是否提供英语作为额外 语言(EAL)的支持?

中学的老师也可能访问小学,抽取小组教学或者谈论中学、介绍 他们自己和他们教的科目。

通常,中学的学生重访他们原来的小学,告诉6年级的学生中学是什么样子的。这可以通过伙伴系统更进一步,中学生和小学生组队并定期的面对面交流或者通过电子邮件交流。

# 申请中学

#### 公立学校入学申请

#### 7年级入学时间及流程

- 雅拉的公立中学一般在第二 学期初期举办开放日和信息 交流会。
- 雅拉的公立中学遵守全州范 围的安置时间表。但具体日 期每年都有所改变,整个过 程跨越第二和第三学期。
- 在第二学期早期,我们将向 所有6年级学生家庭分发过渡 包(包括7年级安置申请表)
- 各家庭完成7年级安置申请表

- 并且可以根据喜好列出三个公立中学。
- 各家庭在5月中旬以前将填好的7年级安置申请表返还给所在小学的过渡主任。
- 在五月和七月之间各小学和中学就第一、第二和第三志愿进行交流。
- 根据教育和培训部的优先录 取准则提供场所。
- 各家庭将在八月收到他们7年 级安置申请的结果。

7年级入学申请在6 年级时通过你孩子 的小学办理。

#### 优先录取

当想入学的学生过多而学校没有足够的位置时,学生将根据以下优先顺序入学:

- 1. 来自邻里学校的学生。
- 2. 拥有共同永久住址的兄弟姐妹也在同一时间在这个学校上学的学生。
- 3. 凡教育和培训部区域主 任限制招生的地方,住得离学 校最近的学生。
- 4. 基于具体课程理由而寻求入学的学生。每个公立中学都可能有不一样的课程理由,并且可能要求额外的文件以支

持基于课程理由的申请。请参 见每个学校的网站。

- 5. 按照住家离学校由近到 远排名的所有其他学生。
- 6. 在特殊情况下,值得同 情的理由。

2006年的教育和培训改革法规 定的维多利亚州政府教育体系 的基本原则之一是,每个学生 都有参加指定的邻里政府学校 的权利。在大多数情况下,孩 子的指定学校附近通常是最近 的政府学校对孩子的永久居留 权。

#### 其他各年级的申请

其他各年级的入学申请由每个公立中学各自本地管理。每个学校的流程可能有所不同,学校只有在有空位的时候才会考虑递交的申请。这些信息将在学校的网站上列出。但是多数情况下我们希望家庭可以完成入学询问表格并和带上学生最近的成绩报告参加一次学校游览,也有可能需要参加一次入学前面试。

# 申请中学

#### 天主教会学校入学申请



每个天主教会学校都要求有他们自己的本地招生政策。如果你有兴趣 将你的孩子送入天主教会学校:

- 在你孩子上4年级时联系你的本 地天主教会学校。要求和注册 员或者招生人员谈话(详见后 面附上的资源)
- 告诉他们你的孩子现在是几年 级以及你需要一份入学表。

预约一个时间去学校游览。有些学校每个月或者在特定的一天举办游览。

这些流程是独立于公立学校申请之 外运作的而且要早一年进行,即你 的孩子上5年级时进行,这不会影响 你公立学校的申请。

7年级入学申请在5年级时直接与你选择的中学办理。

#### 入学时间表

- 天主教会中学通常在你孩子5年级的时候举办招生信息会
- 下一年重要的入学日期于每年7月公布。这些日期每年都遵循同样的流程和时序
- 申请于5年级那年的8月中旬截至
- 录取通知书于10月中旬发出
- 录取截止日期是10月下旬

请注意:尽管普遍有报名期限,但很多在雅拉的天主教会学校能够在期限之后接受申请。请联系你本地的天主教会学校了解他们的招生情况。

#### 私立学校入学申请

# 给你的孩子注册

参见第5页维多利亚州教育系统示 意图。 请记住公立学校的报名程序与 Academy of Mary Immaculate(如上)等 天主教学校不同。你应该在孩子上4年级时联系天主教学校,孩子上5年级 时报名申请,而不是在6年级。

取决于你选择的是公立学校、天 主教会学校还是私立学校,给你 孩子注册维多利亚州中学的流程 也是不一样的。

对于所有的学校,你都需要填写 一份报名表。有些学校可能会要 求你在网上完成入学流程。

学校会向你询问一些特定信息, 包括:

有你孩子出生年月的证明(如果他们不是在澳大利亚出生,则需要护照或者如签证之类的旅行文件)

- 你以及任何其他的家长、监护人和/或者照顾者的名字、 联系方式、电话、地址明细 以及紧急联系人的联系方式
- 身心健康信息
- 关于你孩子在家说和听的一种或者多种语言的信息。

每个学校都会指派一个人在注册 过程方面帮助家长。雅拉市每个 中学的联系人名字都在本资源末 尾列出。

很重要的是,如果你有任何关于 注册过程的问题或者需要任何支 持,请告诉学校。

# 为上学做准备

这里有一些有用的温馨提示,让你孩子准备好在新中学开始新的一年:

- 和你孩子谈论新学校的时候 要有兴趣并且有热情。你保 持开诚布公的心态和孩子谈 话是非常重要的。
- 参加所有你的小学和中学提供的家长信息会议。
- 学习学校的日常活动和时间表。
- 确保你孩子所有的书和个人物品都贴上标签。因为中学有很多学生,这些物品很容易丢失。
- 确保你的孩子熟悉任何常用 的公共交通。或许可以在夏 天练习一下乘坐公共交通。 设定后备计划,以防你的孩

子错过了公共交通。

- 在给你的孩子注册入学之前 弄清楚学校校服的要求。通 常学校要求他们的学生在上 学时间、上学和回家路上以 及他们在课外时间参加学校 活动的时候穿校服。
- 有些学校有校服供应商的安排或者你可以在学校的商店里购买校服。学校也可能在一年中组织出售二手校服。如果你需要帮助购买校服或者鞋子,请询问你孩子的学校。
- 有些学校可能要求你的孩子 拥有自己的设备,比如iPad 或者笔记本电脑。因为多数 学校有这些设备可以借或者 租用,如果你需要帮助请询 问你孩子的学校。

# 开始上学

随着你孩子开始上中学,你会有很多机会继续积极的了解他们在学校所学的是什么。

你可以采用以下方式在家支持你的孩子:

- 仔细聆听你的孩子并且提供 建议
- 确保你的孩子在学期中每天 都按时到校上学,除非他们 生病了。
- 帮助你的孩子养成一个良好的睡眠习惯,以此确保他们每小时有推荐的9-10小时睡眠。
- 弄清学校的家庭作业政策并和你的孩子讨论

- 询问你的孩子他们需要完成的家庭作业任务
- 帮助你的孩子制定家庭作业 时间表
- 即使你不能再某一特定的家庭作业上帮助你的孩子,你可以通过鼓励他们找出所需要的信息来帮助他们
- 提供舒适和安静的空间让你的孩子做家庭作业
- 找到本地的家庭作业俱乐部 并且鼓励你的孩子参加
- 帮助你的孩子维持学习和娱 乐活动之间的平衡,以避免 给你的孩子太多的压力

通过做以下事情保持参与到你孩子的学习之中:

- 通过在一年的早期联系你孩子的老师和参加家长会与老师建立良好关系。
- 弄清谁是你孩子的年级主任或者指导教室老师
- 如果你有任何问题,致电学 校或者和学校预约
- 通过参加理事会、家长委员会或者自愿者而参加到学校生活中
- 通过阅读校报以及定期查看 学校的网站,即时了解学校 里发生的事
- 利用学校的家长门户,例如 Compass,即时了解你孩子 的学习情况。如果你在进入 或者使用这个系统方面需要 帮助,请向学校询问。



每天上学是子女教育中最为重要的组成部分。 学生每天在学校学习新的知识——不上学就会 使他们落后于同龄人。

#### 上学为何重要

我们都希望学生能获得良好的教育, 而良好教育的基础始于学生每一天都 到校上课。

通过每天上学,学生会培养良好的习惯。这些习惯对于学生毕业以后的成功,无论是从事工作还是继续求学深造,都必不可少。

缺勤会对学生的学业和社交发展都 产生巨大的影响。这会影响他们的 考试成绩,包括VCE成绩。同样重要 的是,这会影响他们和其他学生的关 系,进而导致社会孤立。

缺勤天数的多少并无安全界限——每 一天缺勤都会使学生落后于同龄人, 并影响他们的学习成绩。

每一天缺勤都会导致学生的算术、写作和阅读能力逐渐落后。

#### 尽早解决

提高出勤率永不为迟——更经常上学能带来学习成绩的改善。即使在出勤率最低的九年级,提高出勤率也能实现很大的改变。每一天都至关重要。学校能够提供帮助——如果你的孩子有出勤方面的问题,请向学校咨询解决问题的各种方式。

#### 我们能做什么

缺勤的主要原因有:

**生病**——学生总会有缺勤的时候,比如生病时。学生应该只在真正有病时才不上学,这非常重要,而且培养良好的睡眠习惯、饮食均衡以及经常锻炼会使学生的健康大为改善。

"**休息一天**"——同意让孩子"休息一 天"之前,请三思而行,因为这可能 使孩子落后于同学——每一天都至关 重要。

**逃课**——学生未经家长同意不去上学。学生逃课会有很多原因,家校合作是解决问题的最好方式。

# 每一天 都至关 重要

## 中学出勤率

尽管所有缺勤都不利于学业表现,但无故 缺勤则会更明显地预示学生的阅读和算术 能力将落后。

如果你的孩子出于任何原因必须缺勤,你可以和学校一起采取一些措施确保孩子不会落后于同龄人:

- 联系班主任,了解孩子需要做哪些作业才能跟上进度。
- 和教师一起制定一个缺勤学习计划, 并确保孩子完成该计划。

请记住,每一天都至关重要。如果你的孩 子必须缺勤,请尽早联系班主任。

就孩子所有的缺勤与学校开展开诚布公的沟通,是避免出勤问题被升级报告给学校考勤主任(School Attendance Officer)的好方法。学校考勤主任是Department of

Education and Training 的地区主任,有权跟踪任何出勤问题。出勤问题升级可能会导致违规通知(Infringement Notice)。

如果你的孩子有出勤方面的问题,请告诉孩子的年级主任、校长或其他相关员工, 以便共同合作确保孩子每天上学。



ollingwood College is a P-12 Government school with approximately 820 students on the main campus.
