Program-based, this guide predominantly targets learning opportunities for young people aged 15 years and over who are seeking alternative education options, who are at risk of, or who have disengaged from education and training.

The guide covers a range of options available in schools, TAFE, adult community education providers and not-for-profit organisations who are working with and supporting young people. There are a wide

range of local organisations and service providers who are working in the Darebin, Merri-bek and Yarra council regions to ensure young people who live in Melbourne's inner north get the support they need to get started in their working lives.

STREAT

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Our programs are open to marginalised, socially isolated or disadvantaged young people aged 16 to 24 who require a supportive learning and work experience environment to get ready for work or study. We provide a compassionate and constructive social environment with new peers who are also keen to make a positive change in their lives.

Taste of STREAT: Half-day workshops for

young people interested in STREAT's Intro to Work or Ready to Work programs.

Taste of STREAT provides an interactive experience that includes making coffee and creating food whilst learning about STREAT and what we can offer a young person before they chose to commit to a longer program. This program is for young people and their worker and are run on a semi-regular basis, please call the Youth Programs Team for information on the next session. An application form is necessary for all of our programs. The form may appear lengthy, but is very easy to complete.

Fast Track to Work: An 8-week program for young people facing barriers to employment who are seeking work in the hospitality or horticulture industries. Many people who undertake this program move into the 9 month Paid to Work program.

Paid to Work: A 9-month program supporting the transition of STREAT graduates into open employment. Paid to Work graduates receive ongoing support from the Youth Transitions Team, are paid award wages and are encouraged to continue employment once the program is complete.

PATHWAY

STREAT support young people and provide them with the skills to secure employment in Hospitality and Horticulture.

SCARF

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Scarf's programs are available to young people (18-28) seeking protection, and from a refugee or migrant background. Through training, mentoring and paid work experience, they aim to help overcome barriers to employment.

10-week Seasonal Program: Scarf's 10-week Seasonal Programs include weekly training sessions and a series of Scarf Dinners (on Wednesday afternoons and evenings) in a partner restaurant, where trainees are supported by hospitality mentors whilst gaining paid work experience. Trainees are paid Restaurant Industry Award wages for their work during weekly Scarf Dinners, allowing for plenty of real work experience which can be added to a resume!

After 10 weeks of training, mentoring and work experience, trainees are offered up to six months of post-program support with a focus on Wellbeing and Job-Readiness

The Opportunity Lab Youth program is for young people aged 15-25 years who are

at risk of or are disengaged from learning, employment or who are about to leave school.

This program is tailored to meet a diverse group of clients, inclusive of young people who have limited connections to their community, have experienced trauma or have a psycho-social, intellectual/ learning, or neurological disability.

We work with clients holistically, recognising where they have been, identifying what the barriers and challenges are in order to work with them in these areas.

There are opportunities for accredited training, work skills and work experience through our social enterprise activities. We will support you to gain employment that could include with The Opportunity Lab, in the open employment market or through our contacts.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Youth Projects is an independent, registered charity which provides front line support to young people and individuals experiencing disadvantage, unemployment, homelessness, alcohol and other drug issues. We also help those

looking to re-engage with learning and employment.

Our youth-specialist Employability Skills Training supports young people under 25 years on income support to develop communication, teamwork, time management and problem solving, career development and job preparation skills to secure meaningful employment.

Not everyone wants or needs a university qualification. Getting tailored vocational education and training in a specific field helps you focus your future job plans. And all our training is youth specific and takes place in a friendly, informal environment.

Depending on what course you want to do, after completing the course, you might want to achieve higher level qualifications. If further study is not the best option for you, you may wish to gain an entry-level position in the industry of the course you completed.

Whitelion's employment program aims to engage with young people experiencing barriers to employment such as mental health issues, offending backgrounds, drug and alcohol issues, being in 'out of home care (foster care or residential care) and homelessness.

The Whitelion Employment Program offers a holistic employment placement and support service for highly marginalised youth job seekers. Young people referred to the program are provided with a vocational assessment on referral, followed by extensive pre-employment training and mentoring to develop employment skills and aspirations.

Pre-apprenticeships are Certificate II courses. A pre-apprenticeship is a great way to get a start in a career. Many employers are now requesting you complete

a pre-apprenticeship qualification before applying for a Certificate III apprenticeship.

You don't need any previous study or experience to do a pre-apprenticeship course and you may qualify for government funding to reduce the cost.

If you're considering a career in the electrical or communications cabling sector, you couldn't have chosen a more exciting and diverse industry. To be eligible for an offer, you must meet course prerequisites and satisfy any other extra course requirements; and demonstrate your likelihood to succeed in tertiary study by achieving competitive results in one of the following:

- the Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT) - both Written English and Multiple Choice sections, or
- the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) all sections, or
- 50 points (typically four subjects) of single-subject CAP study in assessed mode (with an overall average of at least 75%); and
- Satisfy the University's English Language Requirements.
